What do medical coding and billing professionals do?

Medical coding and billing professionals translate medical records into standardized codes used to bill patients and third-party payers such as insurance companies and Medicare. The comprehensive Medical Coding and Billing for Outpatient Services program can help you prepare to build skills in using all of these codes—CPT, HCPCS, and ICD-10.

Where do they work?

Positions can be found in physicians' offices, clinics, hospitals, nursing and residential care facilities, and other healthcare facilities*.

How much do they earn?

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the median salary for a medical billing and coding professional is \$47,180 with potential for traditional employment benefits.*

How's the job outlook?

The Bureau of Labor Statistics estimates 8% employment growth over the next 10 years.* That's a significant number of professionals needed in the field to code patients' records; act as liaisons between healthcare facilities, insurance companies, and other establishments; and manage the responsibilities associated with electronic health records.
